All the performances are with a hearing loop. Interpreting into the Polish Sign Language (PJM) is available for selected performances.

PROGRAMME

The 16th edition of the MYTHO/LOGIES Festival focuses on the concept of myth and its contemporary interpretations and stage productions. We will ask why we need mythologies, what role these old, sacred stories can play today - their structures, images, meanings - functioning outside their native context, in scraps, in movement, in shifts, in polyphony. Apart from the archaic beauty, are they still alive for us, do they touch us personally?

We will also ask where the need for new mythologies that organize social, cultural and spiritual reality comes from. Just as contemporary writers rewrite old myths, also storytellers seek a new sensitivity, a new perspective, or rather multiple perspectives and answers to the challenges that we face today in mythological stories.

The Swedish singer and storyteller Kersti Ståbi will come to Warsaw for the second time, this time with the "Edda Poetry", which she will perform with reference to various traditions of epic singers - Manaschis from the Kirghiz tradition, pansori from Korea and pandvani from India. A perverse guide through the world of Irish mythology will be the lively and theatrical Clare Murphy. Francine Vidal will reveal various tastes, voices and languages of the Odyssey, and the staging of Arjen Barel directed by Marjolein Frijling from Amsterdam, together with a group of young refugee performers, will invite the Warsaw audience to contemporary dance with threads of Greek mythology.

Among the invited artists, we will host Bob Bourdon (Robert Seven-Crows), representing the indigenous people of Mi'kmaq from Quebec, Canada. By sharing the memory of his people's culture and experiences, Bob places them in new contexts of the global world.

Polish artists will reach for various mythological sources – reconstructing the irretrievably lost Slavic mythology from fragments, extracting what is concealed, hidden, not obvious from Greek myths. There will also be a clash, or perhaps a meeting between mythical thinking, Enlightenment discourse and the myth (logic) of science, and a question about who the storyteller is asked by the theatre project "Historja" directed by Dorota Bator.

The new partner and co-organizer of the festival is the Mazovia Institute of Culture (MIK) – a modern, interdisciplinary institution focused on artistic, educational activity and research. We are coming back to MIK after 25 years because it is there at 12 Elektoralna Street that one of the first artistic events organized by the storytellers from the Grupa Studnia O. Association "Diabolus in Musica" took place.

The Festival includes free accompanying events – encounters in the MIK cafe and the "Elektra" Reading Room: workshops, discussions, films and pictures devoted to storytelling and mythology in general.

THE WISHTREE. STORIES FROM NEAR AND FAR

Beata Frankowska, Ola Pronobis-Polatyńska - scenario, storytelling Robert Lipka - music, singing and storytelling

Auditorium TIME: 50 min | AGE: 10+

The performance was directly inspired by Katherine Applegate's book "The Wishtree". The story is told from the perspective of an Oak. It takes place in an American town which has been inhabited by subsequent waves of migrants. The Oak, which is a home for many animals, is also a special place for the human community, as in its presence multigenerational social bonds have been forged.

In the shadow of the royal crown of the tree neighbours meet. They bring their children, organize picnics, take pictures and every May they celebrate an old festival of the comers from Ireland. That one day the inhabitants of the town hang ribbons or pieces of cloth with their wishes on the tree. It is a time for neighbourly meet-ups,

playing music, celebration, storytelling. Time passes by and new migrants come to the town - Muslim refugees.



Not everybody in the town likes it. This leaves a trace on the Oak the witness to the story...



"A perfect world is consciously created in my head. It is similar to painting and the aesthetics of the indigenous cultures and their way of describing of the important elements of their everyday life. I am interested in and inspired by the capabilities of individual shown through symbols. Turning to my imagination, I show figures-hybrids in a world without aesthetics the way we know it. The pictures depict the harmony of the newly created silhouettes in a symbolic space of the landscape which is often reduced to a horizon, separating air from earth. The narrativeness of individual works also plays an important role, as it creates a new, make-believe image of the perfect world" - says the artist who has been connected to the Festival for many years.



THE RADIANT ONE. **MYTHODOLOGY OF SCIENCE**

Magda Lena Górska - storytelling Serge Tamas - music Auditorium | TIME: 90 min

The achievements of an exceptional individual are usually presented in the category of a miracle: they were simply born a genius. In our collective consciousness they seem to be cut from a different mould, almost godly material. Undoubtedly, Maria Skłodowska-Curie is such a goddess of science. Nevertheless, nothing predestined young Mania to transform into the incredible Marie Curie. She was born in a modest family, far from dynamic centres of science. She became a foreigner, a scientist in the misogynist scientific environment, idealist in the full-bloom capitalism. Always in the minority, in opposition, modest but firm, despite the phantom of illness and death, she will gradually liberate herself from the limitations of her sexual. social, national affiliation... to become her full self. The performance combines biographical facts from the life of the scientist and a magical narration. Little Mania goes deep into the fairy-tale forest in order to look for a fern flower, which in the Polish mythology gives access to knowledge. The young scientist keeps on paving her way through the dark forest of the matter. Finally, a flower of cognition will glow in her hands with blue light. This radiation allows her to look into the interior of the atom and discover the beauty of its structure. As Marie Curie used to say: "The scientist in their lab is also a child who confronts the natural phenomena which enchant them as in a fairy-tale."





Magda Lena Górska, who shares the fate of a migrant with the scientist, has been working on this story of two years in Polish and in French. Last year she presented the first version in a virtual form. This year it will take its full shape with the visualizations by Kamila Białkowska-Ismail and the music by Serge Tamas.

Serge Tamas, is a composer, soloist, drummer, accompanist as well as an improviser. He also plays the marimbula (rumba-box) which he constructed himself. In his music he combines the liveliness of he Caribbean rhythms with the refinement of jazz.

The story of Candide is well known. The intrigue, exile, inquisition, teachings of the master of philosophy, whipping of the butt, separation of lovers, Paraguay and Constantinople, daughter of the pope, savage tribe of Biglungs, cloak and dagger - everything is there.

The adventures of Candide is a story of a man who dog paddles through the ocean of the existence and in the same style through the real ocean. This is a story of a persistent faith in reason which the world keeps on denving; about fate, revolutions, power and disasters of nature. It has romance and black humour in it, as well as a great praise of friendship. There are many contemporary issues in this old tale.

The first question seems to be: are we really living in the best of worlds? Even if the answer is not the most optimist one, and the conviction of our individual agency an our impact on the shape of this world is a strong illusion - one must keep on cultivating one's garden. This is what we will tell.



Stories full of wisdom, humour, colours and sounds will flow during the meeting with the Caravan of Stories and Mehehe which is composed of Szymon Góralczyk, Basia Songin and Helena Matuszewska.

CARAVAN OF STORIES is a group of people who are passionate about stories, songs and music. Caravan is a journey. It is a journey deep inside yourself in the search of something extraordinary. It is also a journey with what we have found and want to share it with others. Very often we have an exchange of stories, sounds and observations. The caravan has been to different corners of the word with its stories.

MEHEHE is an ethno-ambient duo which interprets the folk tradition of the women healers ("the whisperers") and folk magic in an unconventional way. They search for traces of stories which you can find in counting games, old songs and magic phrases. They loop the sounds of złobcok (Polish mountain fiddle), kokles, wolf (double bass da gamba), Asian kashgar and the Shamanic drum in a looper. By using the acoustics, folk instruments, spindles, leaves, whispers, cries and singing, they transport the listeners in the mysterious, dying world of folk magic.

At the beginning there was noise. Perhaps silence? Or the word? People say different things. One thing is sure. You could not hear music from the very beginning. There are stories about the beginnings of words and the creation of instruments. Did you know how Väinämöinen caught a pike and created a magic kantele? Or how Hermes blew a turtle out of its shell to create a lute?

In the performance First Sounds children will hear "ancient first sounds" - myths - and "new first sounds" i.e. make-pretend and play with stories. We will listen to music of the ancient harp and a young electric piano. We will combine the old with the new. the sound with the word, even the storyteller with the listeners and we will sing together. Come and listen!



Jerzy Szufa is a storyteller and cultural animator. He is passionate about storytelling, fairy tales and fables. Philosopher by education. Awarded with the scholarship by the Polish Ministry of Culture and National Heritage as well as in the framework of the programme for young storytellers in Europe (FEST). He organizes storytelling workshops and performances for adults as well as children. Author of the project "The Engaged Storytellers" which was awarded in the IMPULSE OF CULTURE contest in the "Storytelling Project" category.

We come closer and we drift apart. We open new corridors in the labyrinth which is getting more and more tangled. Who will we meet? Here they are: Demeter and Persephone, Pasiphaë and Minotaur. Athena and Metis, Daedalus and Icarus - mythical family connections which we follow and which are reflected in our fate and in our experience. We see images of absorption and rejection, loneliness and longing, drifting apart and coming closer. We will be led by shards, pieces and chips. The goblet of the Minoan Phaistos with Persephone holding a snake - a drop of blood (whose?) which disappears in the darkness. The image of Minotaur from Vulci who is sitting confidently on the lap of his mother (How did those Etruscans know that there was some kind of before?). We read the "Physics of Sorrow" by Georgi Gospodinow and "Eleusis" by Carl Kerényi. And suddenly we reach a wall. That is why we need Hermes - that storyteller vagabond with winged feet, the family mediator of the conflicted sides and worlds torn apart. Perhaps he will show us the passage. When the ancient Irish gods stepped onto the soil of Ireland, they burned their boats so they could never leave... Clare Muireann Murphy invites us into a beautiful yet bloodstained landscape. To Inisfail, to mythic Ireland where gods in golden halls drink from the cow of plenty, Kings are healed by children, fathers vie with sons and lusty monsters spit in the face of the prophets.

This contemporary performance of the Irish myths of invasion is tautly laced with wit and verve.

CLARE MURPHY is an Irish storyteller, working with different institutions of culture and theatres such as the Globe Theatre, Royal Shakespeare Company, Crick Crack Club. She is known for her verve and lively physicality on stage and contemporary interpretation of old mythological tropes. She likes to use gags and drama techniques. She specializes in myths, legends, wisdom and magical stories. She leads training in storytelling, in communication and public speaking.



THE POETIC EDDA. VOLUSPÁ PANSORI

Kersti Ståbi (Sweden) /original language/PL/ Auditorium | TIME: 60 min

Kersti is a storyteller-performer, shaped by the written culture and a singer rooted in the oral music tradition. Her project of the "Poetic Edda" refers to the diverse tradition of the singers of epic ballads - the Manaschi from Kyrgyzstan, the pansori from Korea and the pandavani from Finland. In all of these traditions it is the First Listener who plays a very important role - a musician, percussion player, someone who encourages the storyteller to tell/sing the story and who intercedes between the performer and listeners. Such a concept of the performance creates a strong dynamic and an engaged relationship between the performer, the listeners and the epic poem. We will see the Polish storyteller and musician Łukasz Szypkowski in this role. Kersti has worked together with the old Norse melodic version of "Edda" and looked for its rhythmic equivalents in Norwegian and Swedish.

Bob Bourdon is a mixed blood, "bois brûlée", the citizen of the Métis Nation of Canada. He has roots in the Mi'kmag Nation in the Atlantic Coast of Quebec, and at the same time in the line of French colonialists of Acadia. Storyteller, musician, writer, composer, performer, has been sharing the treasures of the culture of his people at festivals in America, Europe and in the world. He performs a traditional repertoire as well as his own original stories and songs, accompanied by a hand drum and a guitar. He was a musical director of a few theatre plays and the director of the choir "A Package of Care" for sixty voices and ten musicians. He uses the richness and depth of indigenous culture in his work with the men in prison and young descendants of the First Nations who are in the process of social reinsertion. His work has an ecological and spiritual dimension.

Do words really shape reality? There are countries where storytelling is treated equally with music, theatre and film. Although in Poland this phenomenon is not as popular, we can meet many sensitive and wise people who cultivate and develop this form of art. It is them we are looking at on stage. The scenario is based on conversations with storytellers and fabulists in Poland. It is based on a story of loss which corresponds with real events from the life of one of the characters in the performance. The show combines documentary theatre with the theatre of form.

The performance was carried out in the Jerzy Grotowski Institute in the scope of the project "Teatr na faktach" and in the framework of the "Storytellers" project by Dorota Bator.

Multiculturalism, multilingualism and the curiosity of the other is at the heart of activity of Francine Vidal, the storyteller-globetrotter who has set up her camp among the wineries of Burgundy after years of travelling. She organizes performances, workshops and interdisciplinary events in a renovated shed, gathering people of different walks of life. She has initiated projects on a large scale in

the scope of the Caracol Group she founded. The narration of Francine Vidal will be interwoven with the sounds of the guitar and marimbula of Serge Tamas and the stage interpreting of Magda Lena Górska. Episodes from the epic poem of Homer with today's "small" odysseys - the story of the journey of a young Palestinian woman, exile of a refugee or a story of an inhabitants of today's countryside. The main thread of the story is the question: What makes you feel at home outside your own territory? Is it a word, a gesture, smell or a few sounds of music? In this way, through the archetypical picture of Odysseus, around him and outside him burning questions about the feeling of identity and exile are surfaced. Each one of us has their own odyssey. 9.00pm HERO(INE). MYTHS IN THE RHYTHM OF HIP-HOP

The creators of the performance ask the question what the old Greek myths say about the contemporary times. HERO(INE) is not a heroic story with a traditional interpretation but a modern, dynamic production in which the number of music beats sets the level of the struggle or passion of the characters of the story as well as their narrators. The creators share this passion with the writer

Stephen Fry whose new reading of the old stories became a true inspiration for the team. The basic topic which is explored by the artists from the Netherlands is the role of gender in ancient Greece and in 2021. Three millennials of different cultural roots, under the supervision of the director and the dramatist, translate the Greek myths to the reality of their own life. Nothing is set in stone, these stories are still alive as a record of human experiences.
